

USF Open Water Scuba Class

(all information in this publication is subject to change)

The USF Campus Recreation Center sponsors a SCUBA class **open to the general public**. The class culminates with a nationally recognized SCUBA certification issued by the National Association of Underwater Instructors (NAUI). In order to receive this certification, all certification requirements **MUST** be met.

The class meets 2 nights per week on a Monday and Wednesday schedule for a total of 4 weeks. Each class begins at 7 PM and is scheduled until 10 PM. A typical evening consists of 1 ½ hours of lecture followed by 1 ½ hours in the indoor heated pool. To earn your certification you must pass a water evaluation, **attend and successfully complete all pool sessions**, the written exam and satisfactorily complete the 5 open water dives. The checkout dives are held over 2 separate days on the weekends. The dives must be completed in succession - the Crystal River dives must be successfully completed before you can attend the dives at Blue Grotto.

A typical class schedule (see website for starting dates)

Week One

Monday Orientation/Registration – approx.. 1 ½ hour – no water session/no gear needed

Wednesday 1 ½ hour lecture / 1 ½ hour pool session

Week Two

Monday 1 ½ hour lecture / 1 ½ hour pool session

Wednesday 1 ½ hour lecture / 1 ½ hour pool session

Week Three

Monday 1 ½ hour lecture / 1 ½ hour pool session

Wednesday 1 ½ hour lecture / 1 ½ hour pool session

Saturday (following the 5th pool session) - Crystal River Dives 1, 2 & 3

Week Four

Monday 1 ½ hour lecture / 1 ½ hour pool session

Wednesday Final Exam – no pool session

Saturday (following the 6th pool session and FE) – Blue Grotto Dives 4 & 5

All students need to supply their own mask, fins, and snorkel for the course. You do not need these items for the first evening of class (orientation). We will be covering how to properly fit and purchase the items needed during the first class. This will allow you to become properly educated before shopping for gear.
