EXPLORE AN HISTORIC OPPORTUNITY: RESTORE FUNDING AND USF RESEARCH

Description: Through partnerships with organizations such as the Florida Institute of Oceanography, Gulf of Mexico Research Initiative consortia, and Gulf of Mexico University Research Collaborative, as well as state and federal agencies, USF's College of Marine Science has continued to enhance the university's reputations a global leader in applying science to society's needs through research, service, and the training of future scientists.

In order to maintain this position of leadership, however, it is critically important that USF stay on the forefront of the planning for new ocean observing initiatives in the Gulf.

Through the federal Resources and Ecosystems Sustainability, Tourist Opportunity, and Revived Economies Act, Florida-based researchers in many disciplines including biology, business, chemistry, education, engineering, environmental science, geology, history, physical oceanography, public health, and robotics, to name only some, could be eligible to receive up to \$200 million or more funding for projects related to the Gulf region's recovery from the 2010 Deepwater Horizon oil spill and ongoing challenges such as loss of marine habitat, invasive species, climate change, and global sea level rise.

For USF, there RESTORE Act funds represent a historic opportunity to raise even further the university's stature as one of the nation's top research institution's while also contributing to the environmental and economical resurgence of our state, whose future always has been closely tied to the health of its environment, particularly the Gulf of Mexico.

So that we may together explore more fully the potential to expand USF's pivotal role in both studying and helping to manage this vital natural resource, please plan to attend a special Oceanography Summit on Friday, Aug. 16, from 9:00 am until noon in Marshall Student Center Room 3709.

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The University of South Florida is a high-impact, global research university dedicated to student success. USF is classified by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching in the top tier of research universities, a distinction attained by only 2.2 percent of all universities. It ranks 50th in the nation for federal expenditures in research and total expenditures in research among all U.S. universities, public or private, according to the National Science Foundation. The USF System has an annual budget of \$1.5 billion, an annual economic impact of \$3.7 billion, and serves 47,000 students in Tampa, St. Petersburg, Sarasota-Manatee and Lakeland.
