The major aim of this talk is to characterize, through an institutional analysis of the Faculdade de Filosofia, Ciências e Letras at University of São Paulo and Escola Livre de Sociologia e Política, the impact of a transnational circuit of scholars, ideas, and scientific paradigms in the development of Brazilian anthropology in the 1940s. More specifically, the talk aims to increase the understanding of the interactions between scholars and national traditions within the discipline in Brazil by showing how theoretical paradigms are developed, deployed, and defended in international interactions rather than in static and circumscribed local institutional contexts.
